- Must enter 3 or more projects to qualify for gate pass.

RABBITS/CAVIES

- Rabbits and guinea pigs are great starter fair projects.
- Easy to handle, able to grow in cage or outdoor pen.
- Rabbits/cavies are brought to the fair on Sunday and remain on grounds throughout the fair.
- Exhibition or show rabbits/cavies must be born and owned by May 15th.
- Market rabbits are shown either as individuals or pens and must weigh 3.5 5.5 lbs.
- Market rabbits are sold at the livestock auction.

POULTRY

- Poultry is a great starter fair project.
- Easy to handle, able to grow in cage or outdoor pen.
- Poultry are brought to the fair on Sunday and remain on grounds throughout the fair.
- Exhibition or show poultry must be in possession May 1st.
- Market poultry includes chickens, turkeys, ducks, geese, pheasants, & quail.
- Market poultry must be raised from hatch to market size depending on species (6 -24 weeks).
- Market poultry are sold at the livestock auction.

GOATS

- Goats are a great starter fair project and you can use your pet goat to show at the fair.
- Fun and educational project that teaches lifelong skills.
- Dairy, pygmy, fiber, and market goats can be shown in a variety of breed classes.
- Market goats must be in possession as of May 1st and must weigh a minimum of 50 lbs at fair.
- May show 2 market goats in pairs class as well.
- Market goats must be tagged in the 3rd Saturday of May at the fairgrounds.
- Market goats are sold at the livestock auction.

BEEF CATTLE

- Youth raises animal at home and brings to the fair to show.
- Cattle are led by halters in show ring.
- · Requires daily care of animal feeding & water.
- Requires daily work with animals to get halter broke to walk and stand in show ring.
- <u>Feeder calves</u> weigh 300 650 lbs at fair (must be owned by June 1st)
- Market beef Steers or heifers weighing at 900-1500 lbs at fair (must be weighed in 1st Saturday of February).
- May show breeding stock (6 months old or older).

DAIRY CATTLE

- Family-oriented showing with relaxed competition and strong emphasis on learning.
- Great to gain experience with larger animal species with help of dairy department and club.
- · Meet and make great friends.
- May own a dairy breed cow (female) from the calf age to over five years.
- One animal may be borroweded if a youthr has no other dairy animals available to them.
- Dairy cattle must be shown with halter and trained to walk in the show ring.

SHEEP

- Youth raises a sheep at home & brings to fair to show.
- Fun and educational project that teaches lifelong skills where friends can be made.
- Breeding sheep and market lambs are shown in specific classes
- Market lambs must be in possession as of May 15th and must weigh a minimum of 90 lbs at fair.
- May show 2 market lambs in pen class as well.
- Market lambs must be registered in FairEntry by May 15th with a Scrapies tag.
- Market lambs are sold at the livestock auction.

SWINE

- · Pigs are easy to raise.
- Pigs don't need a huge amount of space and if pen is kept clean, do not smell.
- Youth learn responsibility, goal setting, time management, and problem solving.
- Meet and make friends while showing pigs.
- Market pigs are exhibited at fair and you do not use a halter, just a pig whip or guide to move them in the arena.
- Pigs must be owned and registered by May 1st.
- · Pigs are trained to walk in show ring.
- Market pigs are sold at the livestock auction.

FAIR AND ANIMAL REGISTRATION

- Go to EMSF website (www.emsf.org) for rules and registration information in each department.
- Fair registrations are open from June 1 30, 2024.
- All exhibitors are required to register through FairEntry in order to show at the fair.
- Go to FairEntry.com & find EMSF in Michigan to register on line.
- · Create family account and then add exhibitors.
- Age based on youth age as of January 1st
- Registration fee is \$10 paid through FairEntry
- Animal registration completed for market animals
 March 15 May 15 depending on species.
